> Provision of Educational Programs on Blue Economy and Biodiversity Protection

AFMESI's nearly annual Symposia are forums for education, collaboration, brainstorming, and creation of realistic and innovative resolutions. These events provide opportunities for driving resolutions and their appropriate implementation tools to benefit coastal countries in Africa and their landlocked neighbors. For years, our Symposia have brought together maritime experts, youths, women groups, media, political leaders and international organizations to deliberate on pressing issues affecting maritime resources in the continent of Africa, share knowledge on best practices and make commitments on driving solutions to the issues. Due to the overwhelming positive feedback that have been received on these events, we have

continued to receive funding for them from international agencies, the private sector, individual donors and government agencies operating in our host country, Nigeria.

> Guiding Blue Economy Policy Development

AFMESI has played significant roles in advancing the development of Blue Economy policies across the African continent. AFMESI is a key stakeholder to the African Union Inter-African Bureau on Animal Resources in Kenya and serves on the African Development Bank (AfDB)'s Nigeria Circular Economy Working Group. AFMESI also participates actively as a member of the Task force on Marine Litter and Plastic Management in Nigeria. On invitation, AFMESI formally submitted recommendations (in 2021) to Nigeria's Federal Ministry of Transportation on the upcoming National Maritime Transport Policy. The President of AFMESI, Dr. Felicia Mogo was the Lead Consultant on Nigeria's Expanded Partnership Committee on Sustainable Blue Economy in Nigeria (EPCSBE) which was set up in 2022 by the Federal Ministry of Transportation and domiciled under the Office of the then-Vice-President of Nigeria, Prof. Yemi Osinbajo. It was the recommendations of this Committee as co-Led by Dr. Mogo, which led to the formation of the Ministry of Marine and Blue Economy in 2023 by the current Government of Nigeria.

Enhancing International Collaborations in the African Blue Economy Space

AFMESI is a member of the Strategic Glo-Litter Partnership Project that is headed by both the International Maritime Organisation (IMO) and the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO). To this Glo-Litter Partnership Project, AFMESI plays a key advisory role in the prevention and management of marine litter in developing countries. This group includes the likes of BIMCO, the World Maritime University, GESAMP, UNEP, to name a few. AFMESI was the first African institution to be a part of this group of high-level maritime institutions. Also, AFMESI was a Panelist at the 2022 G7++ Friends of the Gulf of Guinea Plenary in Berlin, Germany, invited and sponsored by the G7++ Group. We presented on the effects of maritime insecurity on environmental protection, and in our usual fashion, shared some possible solutions. Our presentation sparked engaging conversations and new institutional relationships which we still have to this day.

> Promoting the participation of women and youths in the Blue Economy Sector

AFMESI has continued to promote the involvement of youths in this organization as part of executive team, as mid-level managers and volunteers. We also periodically, approach the Nigerian Youths Service Secretariat to have Youth Corpers serve at our Organisation, as a way of building the next generation of maritime leaders. Furthermore, Day 2 of AFMESI's 4th Symposium that was held in September 2024, was a training session that was provided for early to mid-career personnel who are in the Blue Economy sector, at no cost.



- 2. AFMESI Cultural Women Dance Troupe (Comot Wahala) at WISTA Nigeria 30th Anniversary.







AFMESI's President, Dr. Felicia Chinwe Mogo, also took center stage as a panelist in the discussion on "Technology and Innovation in the Ocean Economy Driving Change and Progress", where she shared key insights on the subject.

3. AFMESI introduced the **AFMESI Coastal Women Dance Troupe - 'Commot Wahala!'**'Commot Wahala' literally means "Remove Trouble", and in this case, it refers to the urgent need to stop dumping waste into our water bodies. The dance troupe is a creative movement where coastal women

use song and dance to campaign against water pollution while advocating for cleaner rivers, seas, and oceans. This initiative is yet another step towards fulfilling one of the key outcomes of our 2024 Symposium – ensuring the inclusion of local women in sustainable marine practices.

- 4. AFMESI Mentorship Program (AMTP)
 - AFMESI Mentorship Program, launched in 2025 aims to ensure intergenerational sustainability by building capacities among the younger generation. The program seeks to address knowledge and skill gaps at every stage of Africa's Blue Economy development to ensure continuity and progress.

- 6. AFMESI is having discussions with Tantita Security Services Nigeria Ltd on: SURVEY ON ROOT CAUSES OF INSECURITY IN THE NIGER DELTA. AFMESI will train them to adopt a carrot approach instead of militarizing the whole zone, and also how to get the community involved to benefit from other sources such as the evaluation of their mangrove to see how they can launch into carbon sequestration and then help them get into carbon trading, and stop illegal oil bunkering.


